After almost 30 years of service Hartzell #2 Baghouse (above) was torn down. Hartzell #2 was the primary pollution control building for I & J furnaces in the north addition which were decommissioned years ago. In their day they could hold approximately 30,000# of molten metal. The need for large melting furnaces for big electronic scrap lots has decreased over the years, so we are finding a better use for the space provided by the removal of old equipment and buildings. Part of the north addition has already been refitted for wet processing and some storage. Hartzell #2 footprint will be storage area for mother furnace. Near completion (below).



During the tear down process a large crane was brought in to remove the cross over from the north addition to mother building this piece (below) weighed in at about 10,500 lbs.

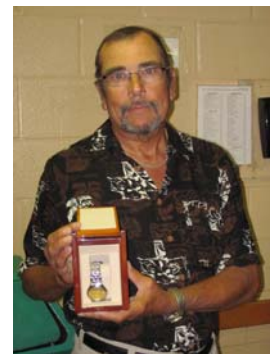
