#### **GM Corner**

Bodo Albrecht:

After waiting for more than half a year, we finally received our knitting machine at Scottsville. Knitting? Here is why.

It's all about nitric acid, the most commonly used fertilizer in the world. Nitric acid is produced in large reactors. The gases used to produce it are being sent, under pressure, through a platinum catalyst, creating the product. In the process, particles of the platinum catalyst are carried from the catalyst into the plant's components that follow.

For a long time, Sabin has been in the business of recovering precious metals from these plant components after they are decommissioned. We then moved, as some of you will know, into "getter systems". A "getter" is made mostly of palladium and sits directly underneath the platinum catalyst. It captures platinum and prevents it from being flushed further downstream. And this is where the knitting comes in... purchasing the palladium getter system separately from the platinum catalyst is an inconvenience to customers, and it leaves them guessing whether the components will work together well. Therefore, it was a logical step for us to extend our business into this lucrative area.

The basic knitting machine isn't all that different from an industrial knitting machine used to make socks or pullovers, except that it is very wide, and modified by us to knit using a very hard wire instead of yarn. The wire is about as thick as a human hair. Its exact composition and other properties are developed within our group, and they are what makes us different from our competition.

Fingers crossed, please, as we roll out our new product to our first customers next year!
