## **Defibrillators**

Sabin Metal – Scottsville Now has 2 Defibrillators on the premises. We are looking for Management Employees to take Voluntary Training in the use of AEDs. An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is a small, lightweight device used to assess a person's heart rhythm. If necessary, it administers an electric shock to restore a normal rhythm in victims of sudden cardiac arrest. When a person suffers a sudden cardiac arrest, chances of survival decrease by 7-10 % for each minute that passes. A victim's best chance for survival is when there is a revival within 4 minutes. Having more people trained to use AEDs will greatly increase survival rates for people in sudden cardiac arrest. Any interested Management Employees can contact Jim Barrett.
