The quality of Sabin's refined metals is second to none, with our silver being accepted on the ME, our silver & gold on the COMEX and our platinum & palladium on the NYMEX London & Zurich markets. Sabin's platinum & palladium salts are widely accepted by industry for the use in manufacturing.

Over the last decade the company has continued to expand its customer base. In 1991 Sabin was the first western refiner in the former Soviet Union market. Creating a joint venture with Krasnoyarsk (the largest PGM refinery in the world) in 1995. Then in 1998 seeing a need for processing of byproducts generated by our furnace operations, SMC (Canada) Ltd. was established in Cobalt, Ontario, Canada. This facility specializes in custom milling of slags, refractory brick & ores. From there in 2001 we opened Sabin Metal West in Williston, North Dakota. At this facility we have electric arc furnaces used to treat various types of spent catalysts.

Sabin Metal Corporation has grown to become one of the largest privately owned precious metal refineries in the world. We have become a Global Company, serving customers with offices in South America & Asia

All of this has been done while also preserving the environment. Sabin Metal Corporation has always maintained a positive stance on environmental protection. Andrew Sabin has personally donated his time and money to various educational & environmental organizations around the world.
